- i. Procedure for Online Payment of Fees and Helpline for Payment-Related Queries may be seen at Appendix-I.
- ii. The Confirmation Page of the Online Application Form will be generated only after the successful payment of the fee by the Candidate. In case the Confirmation Page is not generated after payment of the fee, then the candidate may have to approach the concerned Bank/Payment Gateway (in the helpline numbers and email given in Appendix-I) to ensure the successful payment or to obtain the refund of duplicate / multiple payments.
- iii. Syllabus/Subjects covered in NTET 2026 is placed at Appendix-II.
- iv. The list of examination cities for NTET 2026 where the examination will be held is placed at Appendix-III.
- v. Procedure for appearing in Computer based Test (CBT) may be seen at Appendix-IV.
- vi. Candidates are requested to fill in the Application Form carefully. Corrections in only certain fields will be permitted during the correction window which will be notified at a later stage.
- vii. Multiple Application Forms submitted by a candidate will not be accepted and will lead to the cancellation of candidature for appearing in NTET 2026.
- viii. The candidates must carefully read the Instructions (including how to fill up the Application Form Online) given in the Information Bulletin available on the NTA Website. Candidates not complying with the instructions shall be summarily disqualified.
- ix. The candidates should apply for NTET 2026 through the "Online" mode only. The Application Form in any other mode will not be accepted.
- x. Submission of the Application Form could be made by the candidate online through the NTA website: <https://exams.nta.nic.in/ntet/>.

3. Instructions for filling in Online Application Form:

- i. Before starting to fill up the application form candidates are advised to read the Information Bulletin displayed on the website of the NTA. The information bulletin shall also be displayed on /NCH/NCISM (<https://ncismindia.org/>) & (<https://nch.org.in/>). The candidates should go through information bulletin and confirm their eligibility with regard to age, passing/ appearing in qualifying exam, minimum marks in the qualifying exam, relaxation thereof, reservation etc. before applying for the NTET 2026. NTA will not entertain the corrections sent by the candidate

through Post/Fax/WhatsApp/E-mail/by Hand.

i. Download the Information Bulletin and read carefully to ensure your eligibility.

ii. Follow the steps given below to Apply Online:

Step 1: Registration Form:

Register for the Online Application Form and note down the system-generated Application Number. The candidate should provide the required details while filling up the Online Application Form and is also required to create a PASSWORD, choose Security Question, and enter his/her Answer. After successful submission of the personal details, an application number will be generated, and it will be used to complete the remaining Steps of the Application Form and will also be required for all future reference/correspondence. The system-generated Application Number will be used/referred for NTET 2026. For subsequent logins, the candidate will be able to login directly with the respective system-generated Application Number and created Password by himself/herself.

Step 2: Application Form

The Candidates can log in with the system-generated Application Number and pre-created Password for completing the Application Form, including filling up personal details, providing the details of educational qualification, university/ programme selection, test paper details, choosing the Examination Cities, and uploading the images and documents (if any).

Upload Scanned/ JPG/JPEG Images of the Candidate's Photograph, Signature and disability/ UDID certificate

1. Photograph:

- i) The candidate will have to upload his/her live photograph at the time of filling of the application form and will also have to upload his/her Scanned Images of Photograph (.jpg/ .jpeg)
- ii) The recent passport size photograph should be in colour with 80% face (without mask) visible including ears against white background. Photograph in JPG/JPEG format (clearly legible) between 10 kb to 200 kb.

2. Signature:

Signature file should be JPG/JPEG format (clearly legible) between 10 kb to 50 kb.

3. Disability/UDID Certificate:

Scanned copy of Disability/UDID certificate should be a pdf between 50 kb to 300 kb (clearly legible).

Scanned copy of Identity Proof (for those candidates who will verify their identities through methods other than Aadhaar or Digilocker) should be in format JPG/JPEG between 10 kb to 200 kb (clearly legible).

Note -

NTA reserves the right for verification of the candidate's details and photographs. Candidates are advised to update their details on Aadhaar Card with their recent Photograph, Name, Date of Birth, Gender, Address etc. (for updation in Aadhaar, please follow UIDAI Guidelines).

For capturing Live Photograph, candidates should switch on their camera or connect their webcam to the device used for filling up the Application Form. If your device does not support a webcam, QR code on the right can be scanned by the candidate using a mobile device/tablet etc. Candidates should ensure there is a light-colored background with proper lighting, and 80% face visibility (including ears, without a mask).

For PwD/PwBD candidates, the details of the UDID Card as uploaded will be verified from UDID portal of the Department of Empowerment of Persons with Disabilities (DePWD). Those who do not have UDID Card should upload Disability Certificate in the proper format and the same may be verified by NTA from the issuing authority.

The Candidate has to upload his/ her own photograph, signature, and certificate(s) as mentioned above (and not of anybody else) in a correct/ proper manner. In case, it is found at any time in the future that the Candidate has used/uploaded the photograph, signature, and certificate(s) of someone else in his/ her Application Form/ admit card, or he/ she has tampered his/ her Admit Card/ Result/ Scorecard, these acts of the candidate shall be treated as Unfair Means (UM) Practices and treated with the suitable actions as contemplated under the provisions of the Information Bulletin relating to Unfair Means Practices.

Step 3: Fee Payment:

After completing Step 1 and Step 2, the candidates have to pay the requisite examination fees. The fees can be paid only through online mode using Net Banking, Credit Card, Debit Card and UPI. Processing charges and GST as applicable are chargeable to the candidates (in addition to the examination fees) by the concerned Bank/Payment Gateway Integrator. After successful payment, candidate will be able to print the Confirmation Page.

In case the Confirmation Page is not generated after payment of fee then the transaction is cancelled and the candidates have to approach the concerned bank for refund of amount. However, the candidate has to make another payment/transaction, in case the Confirmation Page is not generated. Any such cases of multiple payments (if any) will be reconciled by the NTA after the declaration of final result and will be refunded to the concerned candidates.

Note: No request for refund of fee once remitted by the candidate, will be entertained by NTA under any circumstances.

Step 4: Confirmation Page:

1. All 3 Steps can be done together or at separate timings. The submission of the Application of a candidate could be considered as successful and his/ her candidature would be confirmed only on the successful transaction/receipt of the prescribed application fee from him/ her.

- b. Download, save and print a copy of the Confirmation Page of the Application Form (which would be downloadable only after the successful remittance of the fee) for future reference.

Important Instruction about PASSWORD:

- a. During online form filling, the candidate will be required to choose PASSWORD and Security Question and its Answer. The candidate is advised to record/remember his/her password for all future logins.
- b. For subsequent logins, the candidate will be able to login directly with his/her respective system generated Application Number and the chosen Password.
- c. The candidate is advised not to disclose or share his/her password with anybody. Neither NTA nor NIC will be responsible for the violation or misuse of the password of a candidate.
- d. Candidates can change their passwords after login, if desired.
- e. Candidates should remember to log out at the end of their session so that the particulars of the candidate cannot be tampered with or modified by unauthorized persons.
- f. The Password must be created as per the following policy:

CHAPTER-1 INTRODUCTION

1.1 About National Testing Agency (NTA)

The Ministry of Human Resource Development (MHRD), which is now known as Ministry of Education (MoE), Government of India (GOI) has established the National Testing Agency (NTA) as an independent, autonomous, and self-sustained premier testing organization under the Societies Registration Act (1860) for conducting efficient, transparent and international standards tests in order to assess the competency of candidates for admissions to premier higher education institutions.

The National Testing Agency (NTA) has been designated for conducting National Teachers Eligibility Test (NTET) since 2024, on behalf of Ministry of AYUSH/NCISM/NCH with the approval of the Ministry of Education.

1.2 About National Commission for Indian System of Medicine (NCISM)

The National Commission for Indian System of Medicine is the statutory body constituted under NCISM Act, 2020 (No. 14 of 2020) vide Gazette notification extraordinary Part (ii) Section 1 dated 21.09.2020.

An Act to provide for a medical education system that improves access to quality and affordable medical education, ensures availability of adequate and high quality medical professionals of Indian System of Medicine in all parts of the country; that promotes equitable and universal healthcare that encourages community health perspective and makes services of such medical professionals accessible and affordable to all the citizens; that promotes national health goals; that encourages such medical professionals to adopt latest medical research in their work and to contribute to research; that has an objective periodic and transparent assessment of medical institutions and facilitates maintenance of a medical register of Indian System of Medicine for India and enforces high ethical standards in all aspects of medical services; that is flexible to adapt to the changing needs and has an effective grievance redressal mechanism and for matters connected therewith or incidental thereto.

Conduction of National Teachers' Eligibility Test for the postgraduates of each discipline of the Indian System of Medicine (Ayurveda, Unani and Siddha) who desire to take up teaching profession in that discipline is governed under NCISM Act 2020 (Ref. Section 17 of NCISM Act 2020) and National Commission for Indian System of Medicine (National Examinations for Indian System of Medicine) Regulations, 2023.

1.3 About National Commission for Homoeopathy (NCH)

The National Commission for Homoeopathy is the statutory body constituted under NCM Act, 2020 (No. 15 of 2020) vide Gazette notification extraordinary Part (ii) Section 1 dated 21.09.2020.

An Act to provide for a medical education system that improves access to quality and affordable medical education, ensures availability of adequate and high quality Homoeopathy medical professionals in all parts of the country; that promotes equitable and universal healthcare that encourages community health perspective and makes services of Homoeopathy medical professionals accessible and affordable to all the citizens; that promotes national health goals; that encourages Homoeopathy medical professionals to adopt latest medical research in their work and to contribute to research; that has an objective periodic and transparent assessment of medical institutions and facilitates maintenance of a Homoeopathy medical register for India and enforces high ethical standards in all aspects of medical services; that is flexible to adapt to the changing needs and has an effective grievance redressal mechanism and for matters connected therewith or incidental thereto.

Conduction of National Teachers' Eligibility Test for the postgraduates of Homoeopathy who desire to take up teaching profession in that discipline is governed under NCH Act 2020 (Ref. Section 17 of NCM Act 2020) and National Commission for Homoeopathy (National Examinations for Homoeopathy) Regulations, 2023.

1.4 National Teachers Eligibility Test (NTET)- 2026

The National Teachers' Eligibility Test for each discipline of Ayurveda, Siddha and Unani of Indian Systems of Medicine & Homoeopathy shall be conducted by the Commission for the postgraduates of each discipline of Indian system of medicine & Homoeopathy who desire to take up teaching profession.

The Teachers' eligibility shall be valid for a period of ten years from the date of qualifying National Teachers' Eligibility Test for Indian System of Medicine/ Homoeopathy and any person fails to join within a period of ten years or break of ten years or more in teaching profession, such persons shall have to qualify once again National Teachers' Eligibility Test for Indian System of Medicine/ Homoeopathy to join or re-join teaching profession.

The National Teachers' Eligibility test is to assess teaching aptitude; communication skills; classroom management; teaching, training and assessment technology; student psychology; andragogy; pedagogy or such other as may be specified by the Commissions from time to time.

The minimum eligibility criteria for appearing National Teachers' Eligibility Test for Indian System of Medicine & Homoeopathy shall be a post-graduate degree holder in a discipline recognised by the Commissions or erstwhile Central Council for Indian System of Medicine/ Central council of Homoeopathy.

A candidate secured minimum of fifty percent and above shall be declared as qualified in National Teachers' Eligibility Test for Indian System of Medicine/ Homoeopathy.

The qualified candidates shall be issued 'NTET Certificate' certificate by the respective Commission.

1.5 Role of NTA

The Role of NTA is confined to the registration of candidates, the conduct of the test, hosting of answer keys, inviting challenges, finalising answer keys, preparing and declaring results, and hosting Score Card.

The letters/e-mails/grievances/queries/RTI applications/Court cases pertaining to admission related matters/procedures will not be entertained by NTA. The same may be addressed to the concerned Institution/Organization.

CHAPTER-2

EXAMINATION SCHEME

2.1 Mode of Examination

The Examination shall be conducted in Computer Based Test (CBT) mode only.

2.2 Pattern of Examination

The Test paper will consist of eight sections based on the units of the syllabus. All the sections will consist of objective type, multiple-choice questions (MCQs).

2.3 Subject and Syllabus for AYUSH Teachers

The List of Subjects and Syllabus for NTET June 2026 are given at Appendix -II.

2.4 Medium of Question Paper

- (i) The medium of Question Paper shall be in English & Hindi only
- (ii) In case of any ambiguity in translation/construction of a question in the exam, its English version shall be treated as final.

2.5 Marking Scheme

1. Each question carries 01 (one) mark.
2. Number of Questions: 100
3. For each correct response, candidate will get 01 (one) mark.
4. There will be No Negative Marking.
5. Un-answered/un-attempted will be given no marks.
6. To answer a question, the candidate needs to choose one option as correct option.
7. However, after the process of Challenges of the Answer Key, in case there are multiple correct options or change in key, only those candidates who have attempted it correctly as per the revised Answer key will be awarded marks.
8. In case a Question is dropped due to some technical error, full marks shall be given to all the candidates irrespective of the fact who have attempted it or not.
9. Qualifying Marks: Minimum 50%

2.6 Duration of Test:

Duration for each test paper would be 120 minutes. (Compensatory time for PwD/PwBD Candidates of 10 minutes for each hour).

Note: The candidate must have obtained any of the above qualification from any of the recognized institute of NCISM/NCH of any state/centre/government/private approved institute.

3.1 Eligibility for NTET: For Indian System of Medicine & Homoeopathy:

1. The post-graduate degree students in Indian System of Medicine completed (thirty months) of Post-graduate Degree program shall be eligible to appear in this examination whereas for homoeopathic system of Medicine the candidate with recognised post-graduate degree shall be eligible to appear in this examination.
2. The Degree included/recognised under the Second Schedule of the INCC Act, 1979 or Section 35 of NCISM Act, 2020.
3. Any person having requisite qualifications and age for teacher who is working or has worked in non-teaching profession such as medical officers, research officers and desire to take up teaching profession, shall have to qualify the National Teachers' Eligibility Test for Indian System of Medicine.
4. The qualifying in NTET Examination does not confer the right to appointment as teacher in any position i.e. Assistant Professor, Associate Professor and Professor. The appointment to the teaching profession in any position shall be governed by the provisions of Regulations as specified in the National Commission for Indian System of Medicine (Minimum Standards of Undergraduate Ayurveda Education) Regulations, 2022; the National Commission for Indian System of Medicine (Minimum Standards of Undergraduate Unani Education) Regulations, 2022; the National Commission for Indian System of Medicine (Minimum Standards of Undergraduate Siddha Education) Regulations, 2022; NCISM (Minimum Essential Standards, Assessment and Rating for Postgraduate Institutions: Minimum Standards for Postgraduate Education in Ayurveda) Regulations, 2024; Minimum Essential Standards, Assessment and Rating for Postgraduate Institutions and Minimum Standards for Postgraduate Education in Siddha Regulations, 2024; Minimum Essential Standards, Assessment and Rating for Postgraduate Institutions and Minimum Standards for Postgraduate Education in Unani Regulations, 2024; the National Commission for Indian System of Medicine (National Examinations for Indian System of Medicine) Regulations, 2023; National Commission for Homoeopathy (National Examinations in Homoeopathy) Regulations 2023; The National Commission For Homoeopathy (Minimum Essential Standards For Homoeopathic Colleges And Attached

Hospitals), Regulations - 2024 & The National Commission for Homoeopathy (Homoeopathy Post-Graduate Degree Course- Doctor of Medicine in Homoeopathy) Regulations, 2024; The National Commission for Homoeopathy (Homoeopathy Post-Graduate Degree Course- Doctor of Medicine in Homoeopathy) Amendment Regulations, 2025.

5. Any person who desires to take up teaching profession at the level of Assistant professor for the first time shall have to appear for this examination and shall have to obtain minimum of fifty percent of marks to get qualified.
6. Master of Science in Anatomy, Physiology and Biochemistry, Forensic Medicine and Toxicology, Master of Public Health from recognised Institutes can also appear for National Teacher's Eligibility Test examination for the post of Assistant Professor, if the candidates are holding the Bachelor of Homoeopathic Medicine and Surgery degree.
7. Any person who desires to take up teaching profession at the level of Associate professor for the first time and having five years of experience in regular service (after possessing post-graduate qualification in the concerned subject) in Central Government Health Services or State Government Health services, Ministry of Ayush or full time five years of experience as medical officer in regular service (after possessing postgraduate qualification in the concerned subject) in recognised Homoeopathy Medical College can appear in National Teacher's Eligibility Test examination for the post of Associate Professor.
8. Any person who desires to take up teaching profession at the level of Associate professor for the first time and having recognised Post Graduate qualification in Homoeopathy in concerned subject with five years of fulltime research experience in Research Councils of Central Government or State Government or Union territory Administration or University or National Institutions with at least three publication in indexed or peer reviewed journal can appear in National Teacher's Eligibility Test examination for the post of Associate Professor.
9. Doctor of Philosophy degree holder along with Master of Science in Anatomy, Physiology and Biochemistry, Forensic Medicine and Toxicology and Master of Public Health from recognised Institutes can appear in National Teacher's Eligibility Test examination for the post of Assistant Professor.
10. The Postgraduate candidates pursuing Ayurveda/Siddha/Unani streams must provide a No Objection Certificate (NOC) issued by the concerned college/institution that shall be mandatory. The NOC must certify that the candidate is a regular postgraduate student of the institution and has completed 30 months of the prescribed postgraduate programme as on (mention the last date of application). The certificate shall be issued by the Principal/Head of the Institution of the concerned college as per the proforma in Appendix -IX.
11. Postgraduate candidates from streams other than Ayurveda/Siddha/Unani (MD/MS) shall be required to have successfully completed their postgraduate programme prior to appearing for the NTET-2026 Examination.

3.3 Qualifying Percentage:

A candidate secured minimum of fifty percent (50%) and above shall be declared as qualified in National Teachers' Eligibility Test for Indian System of Medicine/ Homoeopathy.

CHAPTER-4

RESERVATIONS

4.1 Reservations

Indian nationals belonging to certain categories (OBC-NCL, Gen-EWS, SC, ST/PwD/PwBD) are admitted under the seats reserved for them in accordance with the rules prescribed by the Government of India/ State Governments.

4.2 Provisions relating to Persons with Disability (PwD)/ Persons with Benchmark Disability (PwBD):

4.2.1 The Rights of Persons with Disabilities Act, 2016:

The Gazette of India, Extraordinary Part-II Section 1, Ministry of Law and Justice (Legislative Department) New Delhi dated 28 December 2016 on "The Rights of Persons with Disabilities Act, 2016. The relevant paragraphs of the above Gazette Notification for consideration are as under: -

Chapter 1.

Para 2 (x) "person with benchmark disability (PwBD)" means a person with not less than forty percent of a specified disability where specified disability has not been defined in measurable terms and includes a person with disability where specified disability has been defined in measurable terms, as certified by the certifying authority.

Para 2 (y) "person with a disability (PwD)" means a person with long-term physical, mental, intellectual, or sensory impairment which, in interaction with barriers, hinders his full and effective participation in society equally with others:

Para 2 (zz) "specified disability" means the disabilities as specified in the Schedule (Appendix - V)

4.2.2 Office Memorandum dated 29 August 2016:

Ministry of Social Justice & Empowerment, Govt. of India, Office Memorandum No. F. No. 34-02/2015-DD-III dated 29 August 2016 for conducting written examination for persons with specified disabilities covered under the definition of Section 2(x) of the RPwD Act, 2016. The relevant paragraphs of the above Office Memorandum for consideration are as under: -

Para IV. The facility of Scribe/Reader/Lab Assistant should be allowed to any person with benchmark disability as defined under section 2(x) of the RPwD Act, 2016, and has limitation in writing including that of speed if so desired by him/her.

In the case of persons with benchmark disabilities in the category of blindness, locomotor disability (both arm affected-BA), and cerebral palsy, the facility of Scribe/Reader/Lab assistant shall be given, if so desired by the person.

In the case of another category of persons with benchmark disabilities, the provision of a scribe/reader/lab assistant can be allowed on the production of a certificate to the effect that the person concerned has physical limitations to write, and a scribe is essential to write the examination on his behalf, from the Chief Medical Officer/Civil Surgeon/Medical Superintendent of a Government health care institution as per proforma at Appendix - VI.

In case the candidate is allowed to bring his own scribe, the qualification of the scribe should be one step below the qualification of the candidate taking the examination. The person opting for their own scribe should submit details of their own scribe as per proforma in Appendix-VIII.

4.2.3 Office Memorandum dated 10 August 2022:

Ministry of Social Justice & Empowerment, Govt. of India, Office Memorandum No F. No. 29-6/2019-DD-III dated 10 August 2022 for conducting written examination for persons with specified disabilities covered under the definition of Section 2(s) of the RPwD Act, 2016 but not covered under the definition of Section 2(x) of the said Act, i.e. person having less than 40% disability and having difficulty in writing. The relevant paragraphs of the above Office Memorandum for consideration are as under: -

Para 3(b). The facility of scribe and/or compensatory time shall be granted solely to those having difficulty in writing subject to the production of a certificate to the effect that the person concerned has limitation to write and that scribe is essential to write the examination on his/her behalf from the competent medical authority of a Government healthcare institution as per proforma at Appendix VII.

Para 3 (c). The medical authority for the purpose of certification as mentioned above should be a multi-member authority comprising the following: -

- i. Chief Medical officer/Civil Surgeon /Chief District Medical Officer, Chairperson
- ii. Orthopaedic/TMR specialist
- iii. Neurologist if available*
- iv. Clinical Psychologist/Rehabilitation Psychologist/ Psychiatrist/Special Educator
- v. Occupational therapist, if available*
- vi. Any other expert based on the condition of the candidate may be nominated by the Chairperson.

(* the Chief Medical Officers/Civil Surgeon/Chief District Medical Officer may make full efforts for inclusion of neurologists, occupational therapists from the nearest District or the Medical College/Institute if the same is not available in the District!)

The candidate should fill up the details of the scribe as per the undertaking proforma in Appendix-VIII.

4.3 Scribe and Compensatory Time

1. The candidate should have the discretion of opting for his own Scribe/Reader/Lab assistant or request the Examination Body for the same. The examining body may also identify the Scribe/Reader/Lab assistant to make panels at the District / Division / State level as per the requirements of the examination. In such instances, the candidates should be allowed to meet the Scribe two days before the examinations so that the candidate get a chance to check and verify whether the Scribe is suitable or not.

2. The word "extra time or additional time" that is being currently used should be changed to "compensatory time" and the same should not be less than 20 minutes per hour of examination for persons who are allowed the use of Scribe/Reader/Lab assistant. All the candidates with benchmark disabilities who are eligible for availing the facility of Scribe in terms of guidelines vide para IV of Para 4.2.2 above may be allowed additional time of a minimum of one hour for examination of 3 hours duration whether they use the facility of Scribe or not. In case the duration of the examination is less than an hour, then the duration of additional time should be allowed on a pro-rata basis. Additional time should not be less than 5 minutes and should be in the multiple of 5'.

Note:

◆ Both the guidelines i.e. dated 29 August 2018 (for PwBDs) and dated 10 August 2022 (for PwDs) have other important aspects such as allowing the use of assistive devices, proper seating arrangement, accessibility of examination centres, etc. which will be followed.

◆ The Scribe will help the Candidate in reading the questions and/or key in the answers as per the directions of the Candidate. A Scribe will NEITHER explain the questions NOR suggest any solution to the Candidate.

◆ It is to be noted that the Scribe will be provided by the National Testing Agency (NTA) if requested by the Candidate.

◆ If it is found at any stage that a candidate has availed the services of a Scribe and/or availed the compensatory time but does not possess the extent of disability that warrants the use of a Scribe and/or grant of compensatory time, the candidate will be excluded from the process of evaluation, ranking, counseling, and admission. In case such a candidate has already been admitted to any Institution, the admission of the candidate will be cancelled.

◆ Physical Disability certificate (Unique Disability Identification (UDID)) issued by the notified medical authority needs to be uploaded in the Online Application Form of NTET - 2026.

◆ The NTA does not guarantee any change in the category or sub-category (PwD/PwBD status) after the submission of the Online Application Form, and in any case, no change will be entertained by the NTA after the declaration of NTA 5000e for NTET - 2026. Therefore, the candidates are advised to fill in the category/sub-category column very carefully.

❖ The extent of "specified disability" in a person shall be assessed in accordance with the "Guidelines for the purpose of assessing the extent of specified disability in a person included under the Rights of Persons with Disabilities Act, 2016."

❖ Candidates must note that the benefit of reservation will be given to them subject to verification of documents. If it is discovered at any stage that a candidate has used a false/fake/incorrect document or has furnished false, incorrect, or incomplete information, in order to avail the benefit of reservation, then such a candidate shall be excluded from all admission processes. In case such a candidate has already been given admission, the admission shall stand cancelled.

CHAPTER - 5

CHOICE OF CITIES

- 5.1 The Cities where the NTET 2026 will be conducted are given in Appendix-III. While applying, candidates have to select any THREE cities of their choice. Efforts will be made to allot the city of examination to the candidates in the order of preference opted by them in their online Application Forms. However, due to administrative/logistic reasons, a different city can be allotted.
- 5.2 The decision to have a CBT examination in cities will be with the NTA and will be dependent on multiple factors. Though every effort will be made to allot a Centre in one of the cities selected by the candidate, the NTA reserves the right to allot a city to the candidate which may fall out of the options opted by the candidates due to administrative reasons.
- 5.3 In case, there are very few candidates from a City, the NTA reserves the right to merge one, two, or more cities.
- 5.4 The decision of the NTA regarding the allotment of the City/Centre shall be final and binding. No further correspondence or request shall be entertained in this regard.
- 5.5 For convenience, the candidates may select their own city or neighbouring cities in their State of Residence only and not far away cities in other States. NTA will not be responsible for any inconvenience due to the incorrect selection of cities by the candidates.

Note: All efforts will be made by NTA to consider the comfort and convenience of candidates, including PwD/PwBD Candidates while allotting Centres.

CHAPTER – 6

ADMIT CARD

- 6.1 The Admit Card would be issued provisionally to the candidates through the NTA website: <https://exam.nta.nic.in/nta/>, subject to the fulfilment of the eligibility conditions and receipt of the prescribed application fee by NTA.
- 6.2 The candidate has to download the Admit Card from the NTA website. The candidate will appear in the examination at the given Centre on the date and shift/timing as indicated in his/her Admit Card.
- 6.3 No candidate will be allowed to appear at the examination Centre, on the date and shift/time other than that allotted to him/her in his/her Admit Card.
- 6.4 In case of any discrepancy in the particulars of the candidate or his/her photograph and signature shown in the Admit Card and Confirmation Page, the candidate may immediately approach the NTA Help Line between 10.00 A.M. and 5.00 P.M. In such a case, the candidate would appear in the examination with the already downloaded Admit Card. However, NTA will take necessary action to make corrections in the record later.
- 6.5 The date of downloading the Admit Card for the exam will be announced on the NTA website <https://exam.nta.nic.in/nta/>.

Note: The Candidates may please note that Admit Cards will not be sent by post.

- a. In no case, the duplicate Admit Card for National Teachers' Eligibility Test (NTET) – 2026 be issued at the Examination Centres.
 - b. The candidates must not mutilate the Admit Card or change any entry made therein.
 - c. Candidates are advised to preserve their Admit Cards in good condition for future reference.
 - d. No Admit Card shall be issued to the candidates whose applications are found to be incomplete for any reasons (including indistinct/ doubtful photographs/unsigned Applications) or who do not fulfill the eligibility criteria for the examination.
 - e. Issue of Admit Cards, however, shall not necessarily mean acceptance of eligibility which shall be further scrutinized at subsequent stages of the admission process.
- 6.6 Candidates are advised to carry only the following with them into the examination venue:
- i. Admit card along with Self Declaration (Undertaking) downloaded from the NTA Website (a clear printout on A4 size paper) duly filled in
 - ii. A simple transparent Ball Point Pen
 - iii. Additional photograph (same as uploaded on the Online Application Form) to be posted on the attendance sheet in the Examination Room/ Hall.
 - iv. Any one of the authorized photo IDs (must be original, valid, and non-expired) – School Identity Card/ PAN card/ Passport/ Aadhaar Card (With photograph)/ E-Aadhaar with photograph/ Class 12 Board Admit Card with photograph/ Bank Passbook with Photograph/ Citizenship Certificate Number for OCI
 - v. PwD/PwBD certificate issued by the authorized medical officer, if claiming the relaxation under the PwD/PwBD category
 - vi. Personal transparent water bottle
 - vii. Sugar tablets/ fruits (like banana/ apple/ orange) in case the candidate is diabetic.

CHAPTER - 8

IMPORTANT INSTRUCTIONS FOR THE CANDIDATES

- 8.1 Candidates are advised to report at the Examination Centre well in time i.e. 02 hours before the commencement of the examination.
- 8.2 Candidates should take their seats immediately after the opening of the Examination Hall. If the candidates do not report in time due to any reason i.e. traffic jam, train/bus delay, etc. they are likely to miss some of the important instructions to be announced in the Examination Rooms/Halls. The NTA shall not be responsible for any delay.
- 8.3 The candidate must show, on-demand, the Admit Card downloaded/ printed from the NTA website for admission in the examination room/hall. The Test Centre Staff on duty is authorized to verify the identity of candidates and may take steps to verify and confirm the identity credentials. A candidate who does not possess a valid Admit Card and authorized Photo ID shall not be permitted to take the examination under any circumstances by the Centre Superintendent.
- 8.4 A seat indicating Roll Number will be allotted to each candidate. Candidates should find and sit in their allocated seats only. In case a candidate ventures to change his/her seat and does not sit on the seat allotted to him/her could face cancellation of candidature. No plea would be entertained in this regard.
- 8.5 The candidate should ensure that the Question Paper available on the computer is as per his/her opted subject indicated in the Admit Card. In case, the subject of the Question Paper is other than his/her opted subject, the same may be brought to the notice of the Invigilator concerned immediately.
- 8.6 The candidates may approach the Centre Superintendent/Invigilator in the room for any technical assistance, first aid emergency, or any other information during the course of the examination. For any queries or issues regarding the Test, the candidates may contact on Helpline Numbers available on the NTA website.
- 8.7 For any queries or issues regarding the Computer Based Test, the candidates may contact on Helpline Numbers available on the NTET website.
- 8.8 In case a candidate, by furnishing false information, his / her candidature will be cancelled and his / her result will not be declared.
- 8.9 For those who are unable to appear on the scheduled date of the test for any reason, a re-test shall not be held by the NTA under any circumstances.
- 8.10 All Candidates shall ensure that the information (like his/her name, mother's name, father's name, gender, date of birth, category, PwD/PwBD status, mobile number, e-mail address, photograph, and signature, choice of cities for examination Centre, etc.) provided by them

in their online Application Form is correct. Candidates are advised to exercise the utmost care in filling up the correct details in the Online Application Form. Any request for change in the particulars and uploaded scanned images at any stage will not be considered by NTA under any circumstances. NTA will not entertain the corrections sent by the candidate through Post/ Fax/ WhatsApp/ E-mail/ by Hand.

- 8.11 Candidates are NOT allowed to carry Instruments, Geometry or Pencil box, Handbag, Purse, any kind of Paper/ Stationery/ Textual material (printed or written material), Estables and Water (loose or packed), Mobile Phone/ Earphone/ Microphone/ Pager, Calculator Document Pen, Slide Rules, Log Tables, Camera, Tape Recorder, Electronic Watches with facilities of calculator, any metallic item or electronic gadgets/ devices in the Examination Hall/ Room.
- 8.12 Candidates are requested to retain a copy of the Confirmation Page, Admit Card, and Scorecard of the NTET 2026.

Note: Candidates shall appear at their own cost at the Centre on the Date and Shift as indicated in their Admit Card issued by the NTA. Under no circumstances the choice of cities for the Centre and shift provided in the Admit Card shall be changed.

Candidates MUST carry the following documents on the day of examination at the test centres. In the absence of these documents, candidates will not be allowed to sit for the examination.

- Print copy of Admit Card along with Self Declaration (Undertaking) downloaded from the NTA Website (a clear printout on A4 size paper) duly filled in.
- One passport size photograph (same as uploaded on the Online Application Form) for pasting on the specific space in the Attendance Sheet at Centre during the examination.

- PwD/PwBD certificate issued by the authorized medical officer, if claiming the relaxation under PwD/PwBD category or PwD/PwBD Certificate regarding physical limitation in an examination to write as per Appendices given in Information Bulletin, if claiming the relaxation under PwD/PwBD category.
- A simple transparent Ball Point Pen.

ROUGH WORK

All calculations/ writing work is to be done only in the Rough Sheet provided at the Test Centre in the Examination Room/Hall and on completion of the test, candidates must hand over the Rough Sheets to the Invigilator on duty in the Room/Hall.

CHAPTER - 9

UNFAIR MEANS PRACTICES AND BREACH OF EXAMINATION RULES

9.1 Definition

Unfair Means practice is an activity that allows a candidate to gain an unfair advantage over other candidates. It includes, but is not limited to:

- a) Being in possession of any item or article which has been prohibited or can be used for unfair practices including any stationery item, communication device, accessories, eatable items, ornaments or any other material or information relevant or not relevant to the examination in the paper concerned;
- b) Using someone to write an examination (impersonation) or preparing material for copying;
- c) Breaching examination rules or any direction issued by NTA in connection with the NTET 2026 examination from time to time;
- d) Assisting other candidates to engage in malpractices, giving or receiving assistance of any kind directly or indirectly or attempting to do so;
- e) Contacting or communicating or trying to do so with any person, other than the Examination Staff, during the examination time in the Examination Centre;
- f) Threatening any of the officials connected with the conduct of the examination or threatening any of the candidates;
- g) Using or attempting to use any other undesirable method or means in connection with the examination;
- h) Manipulation and fabrication of online documents viz. Admit Card, Self-Declaration, score card, certificates issued by any Government authority etc.;
- i) Forceful entry in / exit from Examination Centre/Hall;
- j) Use or attempted use of any electronic device after entering the Examination Centre;
- k) Affixing/uploading of wrong/morphed photographs/signatures on the Application Form/ Admit Card/ Proforma;
- l) Creating obstacles in the smooth and fair conduct of the examination;
- m) Not attempting the question paper for long time intervals;
- n) Fidgeting and looking here and there;
- o) In possession of bits of paper;
- p) Any other malpractices declared as Unfair Means by the NTA;
- q) Any candidate with more than one Application Number (more than one SCORE CARDS) will be treated as UFM, even if found at a later stage, and strict action will be taken against that Candidate;
- r) An offence punishable under the Public Examinations (Prevention of Unfair Means) Act, 2024.

9.2 Punishment for using unfair means practices

During the course of, before, or after the examination if a candidate indulges in any of the above or similar practices, he/she shall be deemed to have used unfair practices and booked under the UNFAIR MEANS (U.F.M.) case. **The candidate may be debarred for 3 years in the future and shall also be liable for criminal action and /or any other action as deemed fit.**

9.3 Cancellation of Result

The result NTET 2026 of the candidate(s) who indulge in Unfair means Practices will be cancelled and will not be declared. Similarly, the result of those candidates who appear from the Centre other than the one allotted to them or allow another candidate/person to write the examination on his behalf will be cancelled. No plea will be entertained in this regard.

CHAPTER 10

BARRED ITEMS AND DRESS CODE

10.1 Barred Items

10.1.1 The candidates will be subjected to extensive and compulsory frisking before entering the Examination Centre with the help of highly sensitive metal detectors. The candidates are not allowed to carry the following items inside the Examination Centre under any circumstances.

- Any item like textual material (printed or written), bits of paper, Geometry/ Pencil Box, Plastic Pouch, Calculator, Pen, Scale, Writing Pad, Pen Drives, Eraser, Calculator, Log Table, Electronic Pen/Scanner, etc.
- Any communication device like Mobile Phone, Bluetooth, Earphones, Microphone, Pager, Health Band, etc.
- Other items like Wallet, Goggles, Handbags, Belt, Cap, etc.
- Any Watch/Wristwatch, Bracelet, Camera, etc.
- Any ornaments/metallic items.
- Any food items opened or packed, water bottles, etc.
- Any other item that could be used for unfair means, communication devices like a microchip, camera, Bluetooth device, etc.

10.1.2 No arrangement will be made at the Centres for keeping any articles/items belonging to the candidates.

10.1.3 The candidates wearing articles or objects of faith (customary/ cultural/ religious) should report at the examination centre at least two hours before the last reporting time so that there is enough time for proper frisking without any inconvenience to the candidate while maintaining the sanctity of the examination. If upon screening, it is discovered that any candidate is actually carrying a suspected device within such an item of faith, he/ she may be asked not to take it into the examination hall.

10.2 Dress Code

10.2.1 The candidates are instructed to follow the following dress code while appearing for NTEE - 2028:

- Heavy clothes with long sleeves are not permitted. However in case, candidates come in cultural/ customary dress at the Examination Centre, they should report at least an hour before the last reporting time so that there is enough time for proper frisking without any inconvenience to the candidate while maintaining the sanctity of the examination.
- Slippers, and sandals with low heels are permitted. Shoes are not permitted.
- In case of any deviation required due to unavoidable (medical, etc.) circumstances, specific approval of NTA must be taken before the Admit Cards are issued.

10.2.2 It is desired that the candidates shall strictly follow instructions issued by the NTA to ensure fair conduct of the examination.

Note: The NTA believes in the sanctity and fairness of conducting the examination, however, it also believes in the sensitivity involved in frisking (gri) candidates and will issue comprehensive instructions accordingly to the staff and other officials at the Examination Centres. The frisking of the female candidates will be done inside a closed enclosure by female staff only.

CHAPTER - 11

11.1 DISPLAY OF ANSWER KEY FOR CHALLENGES

1. The NTA will display the Provisional Answer Key of the questions on the NTA website: <https://exams.nta.nic.in/ntet/> with a Public Notice, issued to this effect on the said website, to provide an opportunity to the candidates to challenge the Provisional Answer Keys with a non-refundable online payment of ₹ 100/- per question challenged as processing charges. The provisional Answer Keys are likely to be displayed for two to three days.
2. Only paid challenges made during the stipulated time through the key challenge link will be considered. Challenges without justification/ evidence and those filed on any other medium other than the prescribed link will not be considered.
3. The NTA decision on the challenges shall be final and no further communication will be entertained. NTA will not inform the Candidates individually about the outcome of the challenges made.
4. The subject experts will examine all the challenges received and then a final answer key will be displayed and declared.
5. The result will be compiled based on the final answer key declared. No grievance with regard to answer key(s) after the declaration of result/NTA Score of NTET - 2026 will be entertained.

11.2 DISPLAY OF RECORDED RESPONSES

The NTA will display the recorded responses and Question Papers attempted by the candidates on the NTA website <https://exams.nta.nic.in/ntet/>, prior to the declaration of the result/NTA Score. The recorded responses are likely to be displayed for two to three days.

CHAPTER - 12

MISCELLANEOUS

12.1. CORRESPONDENCE WITH NTA

All the correspondence should preferably be addressed by e-mail. The email query shall be addressed only if it is not anonymous and contains the name, postal address, and contact number of the sender. An email containing vague or general queries and other queries as contained in the Information Bulletin shall not be entertained. Queries shall not be entertained from a person claiming to be representatives, associates, or officiates of the applicant candidate. The following information shall not be revealed by NTA:

- a. Internal documentation/status.
- b. The internal decision-making process of NTA. Any claim/counterclaim thereof.
- c. Dates and venue of internal meetings or name of the staff/officers dealing with it.
- d. Any information which cannot be revealed in the opinion of NTA.

12.2. WEEDING OUT RULES

The record of National Teachers Eligibility Test NTET -2016 would be preserved up to 90 days from the date of declaration of the result. The candidates are advised to download their scorecard of NTET 2016 within 90 days. NTA/NCM/NCISM shall not be responsible to provide the scorecard through any form. Any such request shall not be entertained under any circumstances.

12.3. LEGAL JURISDICTION

All disputes pertaining to the conduct of the NTET -2016 Examination including Results shall fall within the jurisdiction of Delhi/New Delhi only. Further, any grievance/representation arising out of the Result shall be entertained only when raised within 30 days from the declaration of the result. Further, the copy of the Legal Notice or Writ Petition/Petition/Appeal/Reply may be served to NTA only through: legal@nta.ac.in

12.4. RTI

Information uploaded on the website shall not be provided to the candidate or any other person under R.T.I. Act, 2005. The information uploaded on the website shall remain for a specific period only. In due course of examination or the midway of process, neither any application under the Right to Information Act, 2005 shall be entertained nor information will be provided.

Computer Based Test (CBT) Guidelines

The major examinations being conducted by NTA are Computer-Based Tests (CBT). A CBT requires candidates to sit in front of a computer terminal (node) allocated to them against their Roll number and Admit card. After logging the candidate will get detailed instructions for the examinations. At the designated time of the start of the examination, the candidates will be able to proceed and see the questions on the computer screen using the computer mouse. Candidates will have the option to change/modify/edit/answers already entered at any time during the examination.

Procedure for appearing in Computer Based Test (CBT):

(Sample/mock test will be available on the NTA website: (<https://nta.ac.in/>) for hands-on practice)

- A computer terminal (node) indicating the Roll Number will be allocated to each candidate. Candidates should find and sit on their allocated computers only. Any candidate found to have changed room/hall or the computer on their own other than the one allotted would lead to cancellation of candidature and no plea in this regard would be entertained.
- For login, the candidate will have to enter a login ID and password. The computer terminal allotted to the candidate will display the WELCOME login screen, the Candidate's photograph, and the subject opted by the candidate.

The keyboard attached to the computer, if any, will be disabled during the entire duration of the examination. Candidates will have the option to change/modify answers already entered anytime during the entire duration of the examination.

In case the computer/mouse allotted to any candidate malfunctions anytime during the test, he/she will be immediately allotted another computer system and the time lost due to this will be adjusted in the server so as to give the candidate the full allotted time.

The on-screen computer clock counter of every candidate will be set on the server. The countdown timer on the top right side of the computer screen will display the time remaining (in minutes) available for the candidate to complete the examination. When the timer reaches zero, the examination will end by itself. The candidates will not be required to end or submit the examination.

The Question Status displayed on the bottom left screen will show the status of each question using one of the following symbols:



The question(s) "Answered and Marked for Review" status for a question indicates that the candidates would like to have a relook at that question again. A candidate has the option of answering a question and simultaneously "Marked for Review", these answers will be considered for evaluation. However, if a candidate has simply put "Marked for Review" for a question without answering it, the corresponding question marked for review without an answer will not be considered for evaluation. It may be noted that a candidate can return to any "Marked for Review" question at any time during the examination by clicking on the corresponding question number icon displayed on the Question Palette of the corresponding section.

- (a) All calculations/writing work/Rough work is to be done only in the Blank Sheets provided at the Centre in the Examination Room/Hall and on completion of the test candidates must hand over the rough sheets to the invigilator on duty in the Room/Hall. THE SCHEDULE

(for clause (c) of section 2)

SCHEDULE

1. Physical disability.—

A. Limbless disability (a person's inability to custom distinctive activities associated with movement of self and objects resulting from affliction of musculoskeletal or nervous system or both), including—

(i) "lumpy spinal person" means a person who has been made of lumpy but is suffering from—

(i) loss of vertebrae in hands or feet as well as loss of vertebrae and process in the eye and spinal bar with no residual deformity.

(ii) muscular deformity and paresis but having sufficient mobility in their hands and feet to enable them to engage in normal economic activity.

(iii) extreme physical deformity as well as advanced age which prevents him/her from undertaking any gainful occupation, and the expression "lumpy spinal" shall mean as aforesaid.

(ii) "limbless person" means a person who has progressive neurological condition affecting body musculoskeletal system or it, causing complete or partial loss of specific parts of the limbs, usually occurring before, during or shortly after birth.

(iii) "statureless" means a child or grown condition resulting in an adult height of 4 feet 10 inches (147 centimetres) or less.

(iv) "muscular dystrophy" means a group of hereditary genetic muscle diseases that weaken the muscles that move the human body and prevent work, multiple dystrophy are diseases and passing information in their genes, which prevents them from making the proteins they need for healthy muscles. It is characterized by progressive skeletal muscle weakness, deformity, muscle pain, and the death of muscle cells and tissue.

(v) "limbless person" means a person who is disabled due to skeletal muscle by drawing of hand or another extreme activities.

B. Visual impairment.—

(i) "Blindness" means a condition where a person has any of the following conditions, after best correction—

(i) total absence of sight; or

(ii) visual acuity less than 1/60 or less than 18/2000 (Snellen) in the better eye with best possible correction; or

(iii) limitation of the field of vision subtending an angle of less than 10 degrees.

(ii) "low vision" means a condition where a person has any of the following conditions, namely—

(i) visual acuity not exceeding 6/18 or less than 20/60 (Snellen) in the better eye with best possible correction; or

(ii) limitation of the field of vision subtending an angle of less than 40 degree up to 16 degree.

C. Hearing impairment—

(i) "deaf" means persons having 70 DB hearing loss in speech frequencies in both ears.

(ii) "hard of hearing" means person having 40 DB to 70 DB hearing loss in speech frequencies in both ears.

D. "Speech and language disability" means a permanent disability arising out of conditions such as brain-injury or aphasia affecting one or more components of speech and language due to organic or neuro-psychic causes.

2. Intellectual disability, a condition characterised by significant limitation both in intellectual functioning (learning, reasoning, problem solving) and in adaptive behaviour which covers a range of every day, social and practical skills, including—

(i) "specific learning disabilities" means a heterogeneous group of conditions wherein there is a deficit in processing language, spoken or written, that may manifest itself as a difficulty in comprehension, speech, read, write, spell, or in mathematical calculations and includes such conditions as perceptual disabilities, dyslexia, dysgraphia, dyscalculia, dyspraxia and developmental aphasia.

(ii) "autism spectrum disorder" means a neuro-developmental condition typically appearing in the first three years of life that significantly affects a person's ability to communicate, make social relationships and relate to others, and is frequently associated with unusual or stereotypical interests or behaviours.

3. Mental disorders—

"mental illness" means a substantial disorder of thinking, mood, perception, sensation or memory that grossly impairs judgment, behaviour, capacity to recognise reality or ability to meet the ordinary demands of life, but does not include intoxication, which is a condition of altered or incomplete development of mind of a person, specially characterised by irrationality or stupidity.

4. Disability caused due to—

(a) chronic neurological conditions, such as—

(i) "multiple sclerosis" means an inflammatory, nervous system disease in which the myelin sheaths around the axons of nerve cells of the brain and spinal cord are damaged, leading to demyelination and affecting the ability of nerve cells in the brain and spinal cord to communicate with each other.

(ii) "Parkinson's disease" means a progressive disease of the nervous system marked by tremor, muscular rigidity, and slow, impulsive movement, chiefly affecting old aged and elderly people associated with degeneration of the basal ganglia of the brain and a deficiency of the neurotransmitter dopamine.

(b) blood disorder—

(i) "thalassaemia" means an inheritable disorder, usually affecting only one but transmitted by recessive to their male children, characterised by loss or impairment of the normal clotting ability of blood so that a minor wound may result in fatal bleeding.

(ii) "beta-thalassaemia" means a group of inherited disorders characterised by reduced or absent amounts of haemoglobin.

(iii) "sickle cell disease" means a hereditary disorder characterised by chronic anaemia, painful events, and various complications due to associated

brain and eyes damage, "hemolytic" refers to the destruction of the red
members of red blood cells resulting in the release of haemoglobin.

1.5a High Disabilities (more than one of the above specified disabilities) including
and "blindness" which means a condition in which a person may have combination of
hearing and visual impairments causing severe communication, developmental, and
educational problems.
